What does the Stewardship Board do?


- Auditing of the Church's financial records

Elders

What is an Elder and what do they do?

The responsibilities of the Elders are to watch over the people of Christ the Vine, including Pastor and his family; assist Pastor in the worship service; meet monthly to discuss and decide upon issues important to the life of the congregation.

What is an Elder and what do they do?

Decisions from the past year have included:

- Deciding against a return to the use of the common cup in Communion.
- The initiation and planning of a memorial service for Pat Arent (since her family chose not to do so.)
- Confirming that it is always best for an ordained pastor to provide communion to shut-ins. An elder may be allowed to do but should only if a pastor is unavailable.
- Sunday School has been moved a time separate from the Worship service so that children may attend both.

What is an Elder and what do they do?

Among other actions:

- Initiated search for our new pastor through selection of a search committee.
- Hired Rev. Dell Schomburg to be our vacancy pastor.
- Supervised pulpit assignments to fill the Sundays that Pastor Schomburg was unavailable.
- Recommended that an add-on component be leased for the copier to aid Kristina in sorting, folding and stapling the worship bulletins.
- Hosted the fellowship breakfast on New Year's Sunday.





Ongoing Time and Talents Service opportunities:

Ongoing Time and Talents Service opportunities:


