Philippians Bible Study - Lesson 6 - **Philippians 2:12-18**October 20, 2024

Philippians 2:12-13

- 1. In 2:12 Paul says something that sounds a lot like "works-righteousness" (needing to do something to earn/merit righteousness before God).
 - a. How does 2:13 help direct us away from that thinking?
 - b. What difference does it make?
- 2. Free Will "Reason and free will are able to a certain extent to live an outwardly decent life; but to be born anew, and to obtain inwardly another heart, mind, and disposition, this only the Holy Ghost effects."¹
 - a. God gives us his will and a desire to work.
 - b. Our sinful nature wants to serve our selfish desire, but we have Christ in us (2:5).
 - c. We are free to choose our own actions, but it is only through the power of the Holy Spirit that we are able to do anything that is God pleasing.

Philippians 2:14-15

- 3. In verse 14, Paul says not to grumble or question following God (the opposite of 2:12 "work out your own salvation with <u>fear</u> and <u>trembling</u>).
 - a. When Christ was obedient to death on a cross (2:8), he did so knowing that it was the will of the Father (Luke 22:42).
 - b. Just as Jesus approached obedience with humility, so to should we.
- 4. 2:15 Mέσον = midst "... children of God without blemish in the <u>midst</u> of a crooked and twisted generation."
 - a. This word is used when Jesus died in the midst of the criminals on the cross; when he appeared in the midst of the disciples behind closed doors after his resurrection; and when Jesus will be the lamb seated in the midst of the throne (Rev. 7:17).
 - b. Jesus is the light that shines in the world, then and now through each child of God.

Philippians 2:16-18

- 5. 2:17 "Drink offering" drink offerings were poured out alongside other food offerings.
 - a. Paul said in 1:19-23 that death was not something he feared, but held an "eager expectation and hope" that Christ would be honored by his life or death.
 - b. Paul would rejoice in his death if it was to be paired with the sacrificial offering of the faith of the Philippians.
- 6. Living out our lives as faithful followers of Christ is our sacrifice to God. What are specific ways we can offer our whole selves as sacrifices to God?
