8:1-5

- B. The tabernacle & tent are a _____ & _____ of what Moses saw on Mt. Sinai.

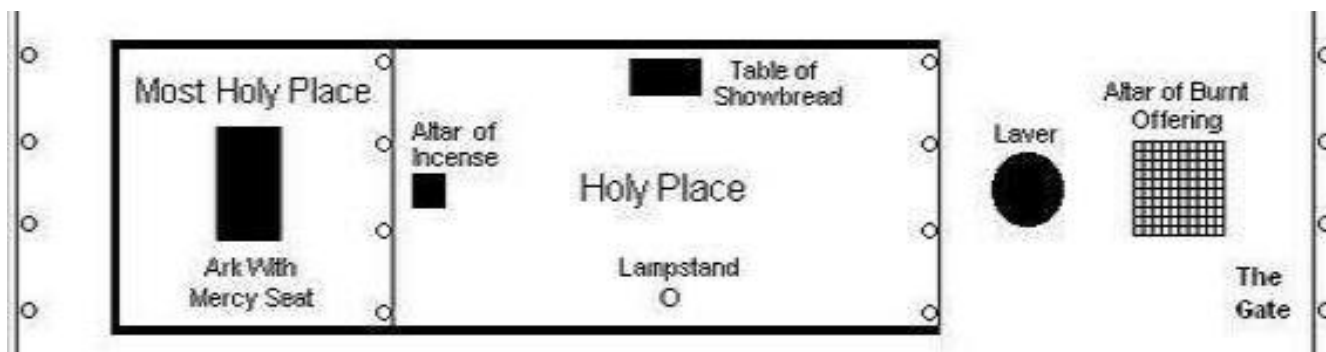
8:6-13

- A. After describing how the location of Jesus' high priestly ministry is superior to that of the Levitical priests, the author quotes Jeremiah 31:31-34 and states that his _____ is also superior.

Hebrews Chapter 9

9:1-10

- A. Knowing that Jesus is High priest over the new covenant, the author writes about how the High priest would serve under the old covenant.
 - a. The author describes the furnishings and layout of the tent in verses 2-5 and the acts of the priests in verses 6-10.



9:11-14

- A. Jesus' high priestly ministry is described as a perfect fulfilling of what the priests had been doing under the Old Covenant.
- B. Jesus' sacrifice was not of an animal without blemish, but it was His own divine and human body and blood. Through this Jesus completely _____ us.

9:15-22

- A. Christ has made a New Covenant in His _____.
 - a. We take Jesus' words of "This is my body... This is my blood of the covenant" (Matthew 26:26 & 28) at face value as His final will and testament.

9:23-28

- A. This passage (especially verses 27-28) is a good simple teaching about the end times. Jesus will come only one more time, "to save those who are eagerly waiting for him."

Hebrews Chapter 10

10:1-18

- A. Verses 1-4 show that no _____ can come through the Law.
- B. Verses 5-10 show how Christ's sacrifice, in accordance with the _____ of God, is greater than the Law's offerings.
- C. Verses 11-14 show that we have been made _____ in God's eyes.
- D. Verses 15-18 show how God delivers this sacrifice to us – through the Holy Spirit.
- E. There are two kinds of sacrifice: Atoning (made for forgiveness of sins) and Eucharistic (done to give thanks for the forgiveness of sins). This passage is quoted against the Roman Catholic Mass and their understanding of what takes place in the Lord's Supper.

- a. “There is no other sacrifice for original sin or any other sin than the **one death** of Jesus Christ.” – The Augsburg Confession arguing against the Mass.
- b. We do not sacrifice Christ again during the Lord’s Supper – His body and blood are **in, with and under** the bread and the wine.
